Overview

During the second Lockdown in Nepal (April 26) brought by COVID-19, the members of Hannah day care centre and the surrounding community took a hard hit financially. Most of the members of both the daycare and the community are daily wage workers and do not have a source of income during this time of lockdown. Children did not have proper food to eat as well as sanitation. In this time, we were able to receive help from Nepal-Inzlingen. Brother Klaus Bender reached out to us and we were able to communicate and support the people in need. We were able to help the needy people twice.

Goals

1. Support the people who do not have proper nutrients.
2. Look after the daycare children as well as the surrounding community

Breakdown of the finances

Title: First Emergency Relief in Khokana and the Moravian community of Kathmandu and Lalitpur

Time period: 11th June, 2021

Persons involved in the activities: The Hannah Daycare committee

Total amount spent: Rs. 83,165

Total amount still available (if any): Rs. -39,465

Detailed list of cost items:

- Rs. 3000 per 16 families of the daycare

Name of item	Cost of the item
- 25kg bag of rice	Rs. 1600
- 2kg lentils	Rs. 270
- 1kg beans	Rs. 130
- Eggs	Rs. 400
- Biscuits	Rs. 200
- Viva(a drinking supplement)	Rs. 400

Breakdown of the total finances of the first relief.

- 1) The cost per relief package: Rs. 3000
- 2) The number of households we have reached: 16 households
- 3) Helpers: Rs. 25,000/-
- 4) Medical support for the local people: Rs. 10,165/-

Total cost is **Rs. 83,165/-**

We have used the previous year's Rs. 43,700 from the relief account and the rest is being used from the nutrition account. Therefore the Relief account is in a deficit of Rs. 39,465.

- During the first relief distribution, the people were told to go to their local shops where we had already negotiated the relief items and we paid their bills. We have not faced any issues with distribution yet.

Time period: 1st July, 2021

Persons involved in the activities: The Hannah Daycare committee

Total amount received in between: Rs. 1,40,350/-

Total amount spent: Rs. 94,274/-

Total amount still available (if any): After replacing Rs. 39,465/- taken from the nutrition account we have Rs. 6,611/-

Detailed list of cost items:

- Rs. 3194 per 16 families of the daycare (not the same families as the first relief)

Name of item	Cost of the item
- 25kg bag of rice	Rs. 1620
- 1kg lentils	Rs. 133
- 1kg beans	Rs. 126
- Eggs	Rs. 400
- Wai-wai (noodles)	Rs. 540
- Viva(a drinking supplement)	Rs. 375



Breakdown of the total finances of the second relief.

- 1) The cost per relief package: Rs. 3194/-
- 2) The number of households we have reached: 16 households
- 3) Support for 5 elderly widows of Khokana community with the same Rs. 3194/- relief package: Rs. 15,970/-
- 4) Support for 5 elderlies of the Moravian community with Rs. 5000/- cash: Rs. 25000/-
- 5) Transportation cost: Rs. 1,600/-
- 6) Plastic bags to deliver: Rs. 600/-

Total cost is **Rs. 94,274/-**

With this, our relief account will be in a surplus of Rs. 6,611/- Will it be ok if we use this amount for the reopening of the daycare. This will be used for the sanitization of the daycare area.

- The lockdown continues but people are now allowed outside but there are rumours about the lockdown being strict again from next week.
- For this relief distribution we delivered the relief to the people by meeting them halfway. We have not faced any issues with distribution yet.
